### The Journey to a new Collective Bargaining Agreement

- Sept. 20, 2022 ILA memo sets Dec. 15 starts for local negotiations to "maximize the possibility of reaching a peaceful settlement on both local and master contracts" with expected Feb. 14 completion
- Oct. 5, 2022 President Harold Daggett: ILA and USMX has "a powerful trust that can help us reach a new agreement which both sides can be happy with."
- Mar. 6, 2023 Local unions told to discontinue negotiations until further notice
- July 27, 2023 Daggett: "2% and 3% raises aren't going to cut it anymore."
- Nov. 7, 2023 "We must be prepared if our demands are not met. Start saving money because that day may come"; "We are facing the most challenging negotiations in our history."
- Feb. 8, 2024 ILA leadership tells locals to immediately resume local negotiations, which must be completed by May.


### Longshore labor costs and staffing levels
